
How will being a Water Champion benefit my business, farm or school?

- **4.** Lets people know you are serious about helping the environment.




How do I apply?

Are You Paying Too Much For Your Water Bill?



You might be eligible for one or more of the following allowances which could save you £ffs.

Domestic Allowance

If you have a water meter and pay business rates, you can claim the domestic allowance – a free allowance of water which could be worth over £500 a year. It is very easy to apply for this from NI Water and it can be backdated for up to six years.



If your business returns less than 95 per cent of water to the sewer for example through evaporation or using water in the process (bakeries, laundries), you can apply to NI Water to have your bill reduced accordingly.

Large User Tariff

Customers using more than 100,000m³ of water per year and who have implemented a range of water efficient practices can apply to NI Water for a reduced tariff.



Other Tips To Save You Money

Where it is not possible to install a meter, ask NI Water about assessed charges.

Remember using less water can also save you fffs.

If you discover you have been paying more than you need to, let the Consumer Council know. We could help and it might help us target other businesses in your sector!
