Snakes and Ladders

What you need

Dice Two or more players Small object representing each player


How to play

- 1. Print out the snakes and ladders board game and the question and answer pages.
- To start the game, each player takes it in turns to roll the dice.The player that rolls the highest number starts the game, and is asked the first question by the person sitting to their right.
- Moving clockwise, each player is asked a question by the previous player. If answered correctly, they roll the dice and move their object forward the number of spaces shown on the dice.
- 4. If answered incorrectly, they do not roll the dice and they miss a turn.
- 5. If a player lands on a ladder, they climb their way up the board. But if they land on a snake, they move down the board.
- 6. The player to reach the finish point first is the winner.
